Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Powerlink Supplier Capability Development Program

Who is eligible to join the program?

The program is open to:

- local businesses in the Flinders Shire, McKinlay Shire, Richmond Shire, Mount Isa City, Cloncurry Shire, Townsville City, Burdekin Shire and Charters Towers Region local government areas (LGAs)
- Indigenous businesses in local government areas along the CopperString 2032 project corridor
- new and established businesses, including people who are considering starting a new business
- small to medium-sized businesses
- businesses that work on-site, off-site and those in the local area who provide support services e.g. motels, hardware providers, professional services, vehicle servicing and parts, real estate etc.
- potential business owners.

What will the program help my business with?

The program helps local suppliers to:

- understand what major project buyers want from suppliers
- be more visible to buyers through quality capability statements and better information on supplier platforms such as Industry Capability Network (ICN) Gateway and others
- be compliant with major project requirements
- understand prequalification requirements for major projects and supply chains
- be prepared for tendering and contract management
- build confidence to bid on major project and supply chain work, and network and collaborate with other local suppliers.

How long will the program run?

The program will run for nine to 10 months at each location. Suppliers are encouraged to sign up for all five workshops to experience the full benefits of the program, including one-on-one support.

How much does it cost?

This Supplier Capability Development Program is free of charge in line with Powerlink's commitment to helping build business capability in communities along the CopperString 2032 corridor.

Where will this program be run?

The program launched in July 2024 with workshops held in Hughenden and Richmond, followed by sessions in Mount Isa, Cloncurry and Julia Creek.

The program will also run in Charters Towers and Burdekin from mid-2025. Further details and timing will be shared in due course.





What supply chain opportunities will the program support?

The program will help suppliers build their capability to target a wide range of opportunities including local council, Queensland Government (e.g., QBuild, Department of Transport and Main Roads, Department of Housing, Local Government, Planning and Public Works), the agricultural sector, large businesses in the region and major projects (current and planned), including CopperString 2032.

How many workshops are there and what will they cover?

There are five workshops in total, plus one-on-one support.

Each workshop combines easy to understand information and advice from expert facilitators, a meet the buyer session, and interactive small group sessions to answer supplier questions.

Workshop handouts and information toolkits are provided at each workshop.
