Who is Powerlink?

Queensland Government owned – one of Australia's leading transmission network companies.

We own, develop, operate and maintain the high voltage transmission network.

We provide electricity to more than five million Queenslanders and 241,000 businesses.


Our network runs **1,700km** from north of Cairns to the New South Wales border.

Comprises **15,449** circuit kilometers of transmission lines and **152** substations.

What is a Renewable Energy Zone (REZ)?


Legend

Renewable Energy Zone (REZ) Powerlink transmission infrastructure

(the transmission highway) Powerlink generator connections

RE7 transmission network REZ controlled asset Renewable energy projects (solar, wind and battery) Homes and small industry

- Geographic area with high $\boldsymbol{\boldsymbol{\lambda}}$ quality renewable resources
- $\boldsymbol{\boldsymbol{\lambda}}$ Enables scale efficient and economic connection of more than one proponent
- Connection uses REZ specific $\boldsymbol{\boldsymbol{\lambda}}$ transmission infrastructure
- May be supplemented by \rightarrow energy storage assets and other system support devices



What are the benefits of a REZ?

REZ DECLARED

Current connection and access

- » National Electricity Rules apply
- » Connection and access is open to all generators that meet technical requirements
- » Can result in ad-hoc development of transmission lines and energy mix

Connection and access under a declared REZ

 » Coordinated approach between community, government and developers
 » Right development in the right locations
 » Seek to minimise impacts on landholders
 » Scale-efficient infrastructure

» Rules for connection and access per REZ management plan

Powerlink's role in REZs

The Queensland Government appointed Powerlink as the REZ Delivery Body on 30 August 2024.

As the REZ Delivery Body, Powerlink will carry out new functions as part of the REZ declaration process.



» Community engagement on REZ assessments » Minister endorses draft REZ management plan and releases for public comment

 » Public comment period and community engagement on draft REZ management plan
 » Minimum 60 days


» Minister decides if the REZ is declared




» REZ declared
